EFYS

Within EYFS, teachers use Early Learning goals to monitor pupils' knowledge of the world around them. These goals are overarching themes for the year but examples are shown for activities that may support assessment of these.

People, culture, and communities:

- Describe their immediate environment (school and home) using knowledge from conversation, stories, discussions, non-fiction texts and maps.
- Know some similarities and differences between life in this country and life in other countries, drawing on knowledge from stories, non-fiction texts and when appropriate maps.

Natural world:

- Explore the natural world around them, making observations and drawing pictures.

Example of application - To evidence these goals teachers will use local area for exploring the built and natural environment, provide opportunities to observe closely, provide play maps and small world equipment to create their own environment as well as represent the familiar, share stories related to pollution and climate change and encourage curiosity.
